Prayer is a discipline of patience, and a human effort to allow the Holy Spirit to do his re-creating work in us. The discipline of prayer makes us stop and listen, wait and look, taste and see, pay attention and be aware. To some it may sound like ad-

vice to be passive. On the contrary, it actually demands a great deal of willpower and motivation. We pray every Sunday as part of our worship service. Compas-



sionate prayers for our Christian community, for our friends and families, and prayers for those who serve, is easy.

Christ says, "I say this to you: love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you." The first thing we are called to do when we think of others as our enemies is to pray for them. Not an easy task for sure! It requires discipline to allow those who hate us or toward those we have hostile feelings to come into the intimate center of our hearts. People who make our lives difficult and cause us frustration, pain, or even harm, are least likely to find a place in our hearts. Remember, it's impossible to lift our enemies up in the presence of God and at the same time continue to hate them. This is why some saints consider prayer for our enemies is the main criteria for holiness.

Compassion means "to suffer with." Compassion asks us to go where it hurts, to weep, to share in brokenness and mourn (Continued on page 3)

So often our lives get so overburdened that it takes every bit of energy to survive the day. We would like to get away from the present moment. We are so busy with productivity and "being on top of things," that we lose sight of what the Scriptures are teaching us. If we are to be the conduit of Christ's lessons to pray without ceasing, having holy patience and compassion for humankind, our actions need to speak louder than words. Most important of all, none of this can be accomplished without God's compassion for us all.
