Where have all the grandmas gone?

The school year is almost over and summer approaches. It is customarily a time for teachers and, oh, yes, students to sing and dance for joy. Well, maybe some of us won't actually be seen dancing, but surely we are allowed a discreet smile, or even a giggle or two!

However, this has been a particularly difficult year in school. It is evidenced by the sight, for the first time, of school staff seen in the hallways near day's end, pushing a large cart of "backpacks" filled with food for the week-end. There are a significant number of students whose Friday school lunch may be the last meal eaten before breakfast at school on Monday morning.

The classrooms' enrollments appear to be in a perpetual state of change, as families' moves in or out of the district are dictated by the loss of jobs. In one instance, we are the fourth move in this school year for a single parent family of four. Staying with relatives and/or friends is challenging for all concerned, and while intended as a temporary solution, it may extend longer than anyone could anticipate, to everyone's dismay.

One of the most heart-rending situations is the distress we see every day in children, who are far too young to understand what is happening, and who should not be trying to deal with the consequences. It is frequently evidenced by an obvious need for attention or attempt to make a connection. The very youngest children look for ways to make physical contact and appear to want to hold on to an adult. In the case of one first grade boy, he "needs" to pat my arm while we are sitting at a table.

Discussing this child, and others who are obviously hurting, confused and frightened, with another staff member, she commented about a program available in a former school where she had worked. In that community, there were senior citizens, often retired school personnel, who volunteered to come into the school for an hour or two a week to be a "grandparent" to such children. The adult's role was solely to read to, talk with or play checkers, etc., one-on-one with such a child on a regular


