Solid Rock group assists with house build

Solid Rock United Methodist Church was one of four churches to assist with a summer house build through Henderson Settlement in Frakes. Kentucky. Under the direction of organizer Mike Tribolet, 12 members of Solid Rock spent the week of

July 29 through August 4 sanding drywall, painting, installing flooring, and doing finish work on the front deck of the home in which a young mother and her son will reside. Several members of the group also assisted with a

variety of tasks on the Henderson campus.

Henderson Settlement was founded by Rev. Hiram Frakes in

1925 after he observed the extreme social. educational, and medical needs of residents of this Appalachian valley. Ministries of the Settlement, which touch hundreds of families in the region, include thrift stores, a craft shop, agricultural resources, a food pantry, medical assistance, new mother and infant care, and a variety of educational and social opportunities. Hundreds of individuals volunteer at the Settlement each summer, fulfilling needs at the Settlement and in the community.

Solid Rock is in a covenant relationship with missionaries Vicki and Gary Stephenson. Vicki is Director of Mission Advancement at Henderson, and Gary maintains all Settlement vehicles. Vicki led the group on a Settlement tour on Wednesday morning.

Participating in the work camp from Solid Rock were David Spahr, John and Susan Mills, Jeff and Sydney Walter, Art and Rose Broyles, Steve Holmes, Bonnie Zeller, Gary and Rosalie Walter, Pastor Kathy Newton, and Connie Herr from Dillman UB Church.

The Solid Rock congregation generously supported the project, providing \$7,000 to purchase building supplies, contributing to campers' living expenses, and donating school supplies, personal hygiene items, as well as items for the food pantry, recreation program, and baby pantry.

Bread of Life Food Pantry Update

The Pantry's goal for June, July, and August was to help families whose children received free or reduced lunches during the school year. Each family received a gallon



of milk and bags of "kids choice" food items (such as canned spaghetti, ravioli, soup, peanut butter, jelly, cereal, macaroni and cheese, Ramen noodles) besides the regular pantyrequested items. We

served 68 homes in our community, including 94 children between

the ages of five and 18. Thank you for all the special donations, and giving of freewill offerings at the fish and tenderloin dinners (Salamonie Church of the Brethren and First Baptist Church). A family gave proceeds from a garage sale and recycling of aluminum cans. Support was received from the concession stand at the Summer Festival tractor pull. One family donated the proceeds from the sale of 50 bushels of soybeans, and another donated 4-H chickens and fresh eggs. Four businesses gave 250 pounds of sausage.

Thank you for volunteering to help at the Pantry, visiting with clients, filling orders, stocking shelves, unloading my trunk, and taking groceries to clients' cars. Without your help, ideas, prayers, designated tithing, donations of canned foods, personal hygiene items, fresh fruit, and produce the Bread of Life Food Pantry would be like the pantry we worked at in Frakes, Kentucky, working at emergency level and waiting for donations to come in to be able to help their neighbors with a minimal box of food items to last for one month.

United Methodist Women of Solid Rock Church met August 2, 2012, in the Calico Room of Heritage Pointe at 9:30 a.m. with 10 members present. President Myrna Neff reminded us of a point stressed by Doris Rapp in her presentation to us in June: "We never go through adversity alone," based on 2 Corinthians 8:14-15. Missionaries' birthdays were recognized: Virginia Moore at St. Clairsville, OH, and Geneva Williams of Orangeburg, SC—both serving as Dea-

conesses, Mission Focus of our worldwide work was recognized in the World Council of Churches Youth Desk, doing resource development through support and training in the Global South, Geneva, Switzerland.

Barbara Hart shared information about the Henderson Settlement of

southern Kentucky as our "Mission Moment." Solid Rock volunteers will be going there this week to build a small house for a young mother and her son. Solid Rock Church is contributing \$6,500 to the project. Henderson Settlement is part of the Red Bird Missionary Conference. Solid Rock supports two covenant missionaries at Henderson.

Lucille Pinkerton gave the lesson entitled "A Home for Jesus," and this is the story of an older woman who made a decision to be a foster parent as her destiny. She took a 14-month-old boy named "Jesus," or "T.J." ("Tiny Jesus" now). She has had 26 children in all over periods of a week to years. Parents may have been dead, or abusive, or in jail. The Oklahoma helping service where she worked was a child care agency. Lucille herself said she and her husband had adopted two children, who are now ages 62 and 64!

Regular monthly joys, concerns and prayers were received and given by Carolyn Winters. Margaret Bell read last month's meeting minutes, which were approved, and called the roll. Barbara Hart gave the Treasurer's report, noting a current treasury balance as of July 31 of \$602.56.

Unfinished business was a pleasure seeing the supplies which have been readied for the school bags going into the lovely sturdy bags made by Mary Emma Holmes. Myrna had done the shopping for the impressive collection of school supplies which are going to needy areas in Africa (a total of 12 bags, expensive to fill but helpful to each child's school success). The bill, which was \$161.27, was approved upon motion by Ann Brauchla Slaughter, and paid to Myrna, and a "thank you" note will be sent to Mary Emma. Future dates and programs were considered before adjournment.
